#### ORDINANCE NO. 2009-2

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE DAMON RUN CONSERVANCY DISTRICT WATER RATE ORDINANCE TO INCREASE THE RATES AND USER FEE PAYABLE TO THE DAMON RUN CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Damon Run Conservancy District ("District") enacted its Ordinance No. 2006-1 titled Water Rate Ordinance ("Water Rate Ordinance") which Water Rate Ordinance established, among other things, a schedule of rates and charges regarding the use and operation of the District's water works; and

**WHEREAS**, upon review of information and recommendation of the District's accountant, the Board of the District has determined that it is necessary amend the Water Rate Ordinance to make certain adjustment to the Rates and User Fees associated with the District's water works.

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE DAMON RUN CONSERVANCY DISTRICT, PORTER COUNTY, INDIANA AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The above and foregoing recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance.

2. <u>Amendment to Section 1 of the Water Rate Ordinance</u>. Section 1 of the Water Rate Ordinance is deleted in its entirety and replaced with Exhibit "A".

3. <u>Amendment to Section 2 of the Water Rate Ordinance</u>. Section 2 of the Water Rate Ordinance is deleted in its entirety and replaced with Exhibit "B".

4. <u>Scope and Effect</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Except as expressly modified and amended herein, the Water Rate Ordinance, as amended, shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

#### (d) <u>TEMPORARY WATER SERVICE</u>:

<u>Miscellaneous Temporary Water Service</u> is available upon application therefore for construction projects located in the vicinity of distribution mains of the Company suitable and adequate for supplying the service requested in the territory served by the Company. Each application for service under this rate shall list in detail the purposes for which water service is to be used.

#### RATE:

The rate for this service shall be the sum of the charges as determined under subparagraphs (i) and (ii) below:

- (i) The applicant for <u>Miscellaneous Temporary Water Service</u> shall be required to pay the Company's cost of labor plus 30% for supervision, transportation, materials (excluding the cost of the meter), use of tools, and overhead and indirect costs required in connection with establishing, disconnecting, and dismantling of the temporary connection. This payment shall be made to the Company before the facilities are installed by the Company based upon amount estimated by the Company. The payment shall be adjusted to actual costs by a refund or additional charge when service is discontinued.
- (ii) The volume of water taken through the temporary connection shall be metered by a meter furnished and owned by the Company. For water consumed through such meter, the regular schedule of water rates, including minimum payment provisions, for <u>General Water Service</u> shall apply:

#### (e) <u>PUBLIC HYDRANT RENTAL</u>:

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE DAMON RUN CONSERVANCY DISTRICT, PORTER COUNTY, INDIANA AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Incorporation of Recitals**. The above and foregoing recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance.

2. <u>Amendment to Section 2(c) of the Sewer Rate Ordinance</u>. Section 2(c) of the Sewer Rate Ordinance is deleted in its entirety and replaced with Exhibit "A".

3. <u>Scope and Effect</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, but not sooner than January 1, 2010. Except as expressly modified and amended herein, the Sewer Rate Ordinance, as amended, shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
